SCHOOL RULES AND REGULATIONS/ DISCIPLINARY POLICY

Bethany High School has a Christian foundation. The rules and regulations governing the school are based on this belief.

Since Christ is Lord of all life, all activities in school should be in accordance with His laws. In any community, the acts of an individual member, whether good or bad will affect the whole body.

An active concern for the good of the school and for the wide community outside the college is expected of every individual.

True education is as a must a concern with training of character as with acquisition of knowledge.

Learning to be honest, hard working helpful and well mannered is as important as learning academic subjects.

General School Rules

1. Obedience and respect to school authorities is expected from all students. A student who does not respect administration/ teachers or any member of staff will be required to come to school with the parent for disciplinary action. Respect for Prefects and Monitors is also expected. Insolent behaviour may lead to your expulsion.
2. Dodging of classes, Tests and Exams are very serious offences, which call for serious punishment. If the Habit persists, the student will be expelled from school. Students are also expected to meet the set academic standards without which they may not be promoted or be advised to leave the school.
3. Cheating in Exams or Tests is a grave offence. Culprits will be punished and disqualified from the entire examinations session and may be demoted irrespective of the class or term.
4. Drinking alcohol, smoking cigarettes and drugs, gambling, fighting, bullying, teasing and stealing are very serious offences. Culprits will be expelled from the school immediately.
5. Immoral relationships between students are prohibited. Girl's dormitories and toilets are out bounds to boys and vice versa. Irresponsible behaviour and offensive language will not be tolerated. Culprits will be given 2 weeks suspension from school. Or expelled if the act persists.
6. English is the official language of communication at school, both in class and outside. The vernaculars are strongly discouraged and culprits may face serious disciplinary action or internal suspension with labour.
7. Proper school uniform must be worn **at school and when leaving or coming to school.** A student who does not wear a clean proper uniform smartly will face disciplinary action. Any wear other than the official uniforms will be confiscated for good if the student has not obtained written permission. Only official **“out –of-class uniform”** is allowed after classes and weekends. This consists of plain **Red T-Shirts for girls and Blue for boys, black skirts or trousers for girls and boys** respectively. Failure to comply, the student shall be given a Carpel punishments.
8. Wearing artificial make-up, ear/nose rings, bracelets, and necklaces at school is not allowed. Long, plaited, braided , treated hair is not permitted as well as elaborate hair cuts/styles. All hair must be trimmed off. Short nails with no cutex/nail vanish must be kept. Culprits will be punished with hard labour suspension for 2 weeks if the habit persists.
9. Electronic gadgets are not permitted at school. That is to say; cameras, radio, mobile phones, etc will be confiscated for good and offenders facing further disciplinary action.

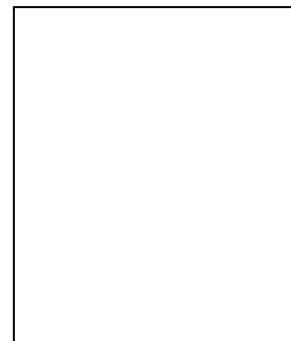
10. A student who maliciously or carelessly, damages, loses, misuses, mishandles school property (and even fellow students' property) will be required to replace it and will not be allowed in school until he does so.
 11. Trading activity amongst students or with staff/unauthorized public, borrowing /lending of uniforms, shoes, clothes etc is not allowed. Culprits will serve 2-4 weeks suspension from school.
 12. Dormitories are out of bounds during class time, prep time, chapel time and other times when school programs are on. Lateness for all school facilities and programs is a serious offence. Culprits will be punished by internal suspension with hard labour.
 13. Staff Quarters, the staff room and the school kitchen areas are out of bounds to students unless authorized or in case of emergency. Offenders face serious disciplinary action of carpal punishment.
 14. No student once in school is allowed to leave without written permission from the H/M or DHMs office. Culprits will serve 4-weeks suspension plus buying 2 rolls of burbed wires. When released from school, the student must return with a signed gate pass by parent.
 15. School meals are compulsory and must be taken within the dinning hall as scheduled. No cooking or carrying cooked foodstuffs into the dormitories by students are permitted. Culprits will serve a 1-week's internal suspension with hard labour.
 16. Self- medication is not allowed without the school Nurse's knowledge or consent and Bed- rest can only be taken with her written permission. Those with chronic illnesses must carry along sufficient medication and declare it to the nurse. All students must have medical examination.
 17. Students' visitors are only allowed on official visitation days unless prior appointment is made with the office. Students' visitors must carry along the school visitor's card and are not allowed into dormitories. Students should not receive visitors during class time.
 18. Students must ensure and maintain a hygienic environment by cleaning their compound, classrooms and dormitories as scheduled and observe excellent personal hygiene. Offenders will be subjected to hard labour or be sent home for parental counseling.
- * **The above school regulations are designed with the aim of promoting a cordial and harmonious school environment.**
 - * **It is the duty of school to ensure and shape the character of its students to grow into disciplined and responsible citizens.**
 - * **Compliance with these rules and regulations is thus expected with out question.**

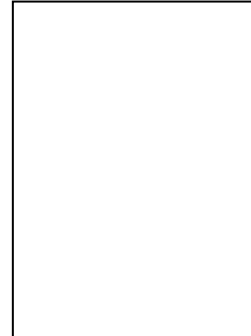
